# Otoplasty Post Op Instructions



# <u>Rest</u>

- ✓ Go home and rest.
- ✓ Elevate your head on 3-4 pillows for the first week to reduce swelling.
- ✓ Do not bend over but rather squat to reach down to reduce the risk of haematomas.
- ✓ Overnight, remain within 1 hour's distance of the surgery in case of complications.

## Bleeding

✓ Heavy or prolonged bleeding - contact Dr Belt on the numbers below.

#### Wound Care

- ✓ Keep head bandage dry and intact until your 1<sup>st</sup> doctors review. Do not remove it.
- ✓ Do not lie on your ears.
- ✓ An appointment will be made to return in 7 days to have the bandage removed.
- ✓ Once the bandage is removed, wear a sweat band (tennis style) at night for 6 weeks. Avoid wearing caps for 3 months.

#### Pain Relief

- ✓ A script will be provided for pain relief sufficient for one week. If you run out, Panadeine should be adequate.
- ✓ Do not take Aspirin (unless prescribed) as it prolongs bleeding.
- ✓ Contact Dr Belt if pain relief is inadequate.

#### **Infection**

- ✓ Please remember to take your antibiotics regularly as prescribed
- ✓ Wound infection is an infrequent occurrence. Contact Dr Belt if you experience:
  - Increased pain, temperature and flu-like symptoms
  - Widespread redness
  - Offensive discharge coming from the wound.

#### Exercise

- ✓ Avoid strenuous lifting, aerobic exercises and swimming for 6 weeks post-operatively.
- ✓ Try gentle exercise i.e. light walking
- ✓ Do not drive a motor vehicle for 7 days post-operatively.
